Sports Partnership £1300

The Watford and Hertsmere School Sports Partnership is a partnership of Infant, Primary, Secondary and Special Schools across Watford, Bushey, Borehamwood and Potters Bar. The Partnership, established in 2004, is based at Queens' School, Bushey.



The team consists of Partnership Staff including the School Sport Development Manager and Competition Manager who are based at Queens' School. Another member of the core team is the School Support Coach and Trainer who works across all Schools in the Partnership. In addition there are School Sports Co-ordinators who assist a number of Primary and Infant Schools.

The team work together to increase participation in High Quality Physical Education and School Sport through co-ordinated PE, school sport and out-of-school-hours learning activities that link with local community sports facilities, clubs and development programmes. The Partnership offers opportunities for young people to experience different sports, engage in leadership and volunteering and take part in competition, including the School Games Programme which leads through to the Herts School Games.

Impact

Working with the Sports Partnership has enabled pupils to compete against other schools in activities such as speed stacking and participate in the School Games Programme. We will also be using the partnership to develop playleader training for the children to lead and promote games and activities during playtimes.

Watford Primary Schools Football Association £20

Impact

Being part of the WDPSFA has enabled the pupils to participate in competitive football with a range of local schools.

Warriors Basketball Breakfast Club £350

Impact

This club has enabled 20 children to try basketball for 10 sessions working with staff from Warriors basketball club.



Sports Equipment £3481

Impact

Purchasing a range of equipment including:

- Gum Shields
- Kits
- Balls
- Hoops
- Tennis & Badminton equipment
- Outdoor and indoor nets

Has enabled more pupils to participate in a wider range of sports throughout the school day. Before school and lunchtime clubs use the resources, alongside all class teachers who are able to include a wider range of activities in their PE classes. Provision of equipment such as gum shields and kits has enabled pupils to participate in sports competitions.
